## **DSM-5 OUD Criteria**\*

A problematic pattern of opioid use leading to clinically significant impairment or distress, as manifested by at least two of the following, occurring within a 12-month period.

CHECK ALL THAT APPLY:	
	1. Opioids are often taken in larger amounts or over a longer period of time than was intended.
	2. There is a persistent desire or unsuccessful efforts to cut down or control opioid use.
	3. A great deal of time is spent in activities to obtain the opioid, use the opioid, or recover from its effects.
	4. Craving, or a strong desire or urge to use opioids.
	5. Recurrent opioid use resulting in a failure to fulfill major role obligations at work, school, or home.
	<ol><li>Continued opioid use despite having persistent or recurrent social or interpersonal problems caused by or exacerbated by the effects of opioids.</li></ol>
	7. Important social, occupational, or recreational activities are given up or reduced because of opioid use.
	8. Recurrent opioid use in situations in which it is physically hazardous.
	<ol><li>Continued opioid use despite knowledge of having a persistent or recurrent physical or psychological problem that's likely to have been caused or exacerbated by the substance.</li></ol>
	<ul> <li>10. Tolerance, as defined by either of the following:</li> <li>a. A need for markedly increased amounts of opioids to achieve intoxication or desired effect</li> <li>b. A markedly diminished effect with continued use of the same amount of an opioid</li> <li>Note: This criterion is not met for individuals taking opioids solely under appropriate medical supervision.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>11. Withdrawal, as manifested by either of the following:</li> <li>a. The characteristic opioid withdrawal syndrome</li> <li>a. The same (or a closely related) substance is taken to relieve or avoid withdrawal symptoms</li> <li>Note: This criterion is not met for individuals taking opioids solely under appropriate medical supervision.</li> </ul>
